

The Millennium Development Goals (www.er-d.org/mdg):

At the start of the new millennium, leaders from 191 nations, including the United States, agreed on a plan to cut extreme global poverty in half by 2015. This effort has been endorsed by many non-governmental organizations and many faith communities, including the Episcopal Church. The eight Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) are:

1. Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger
2. Achieve universal primary education
3. Promote gender equality and empower women
4. Reduce child mortality
5. Improve maternal health
6. Combat HIV/AIDS, malaria and other diseases
7. Ensure environmental stability
8. Develop a global partnership for development

St. Andrew's Outreach Committee intentionally uses the Millennium Development Goals as a discernment tool in making decisions about outreach fund designees. We have made grants to the following organizations and programs over the past several years:

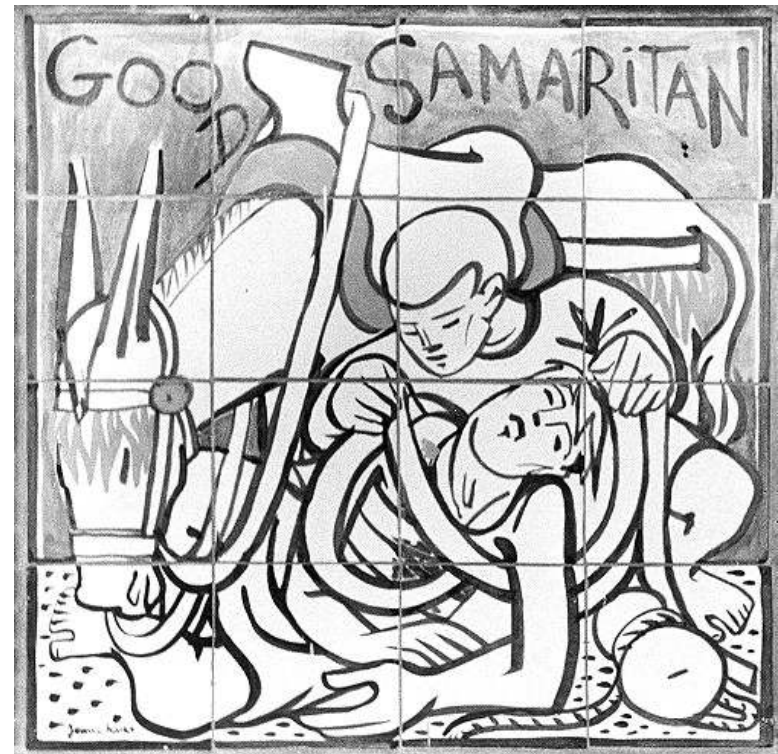
